
## **KEY FINDINGS:**

## 2024 Election Voters Want the Incoming Administration and Congress to Support Policies that Secure American Energy Leadership.

 Nearly four-in-five 2024 Election Voters feel the new Administration and Congress should support American energy leadership policies.

## 2024 Election Voters are concerned about inflation and experience financial pain, and they see a role for domestic natural gas and oil production in helping consumers and small businesses.

How Concerned Are You About Inflation?




 Over four-in-five 2024 Election Voters feel they and other Americans are experiencing financial strain due to the price of day-to-day necessities.

Do You Agree or Disagree With the Following Statement?


Producing More Oil and Natural Gas Here in the U.S. Could Help Lower Energy and Utility Costs for American Consumers and Small Businesses.





2024 Election Voters oppose government mandates, while support for policies encouraging American energy production, streamlined energy infrastructure building, and strengthened national energy security is high among voters.

• Three-quarters of bipartisan 2024 Election Voters oppose mandates that would ban gas stoves, gas furnaces, or new gasoline, diesel, and hybrid vehicles.



 Four-in-five 2024 Election Voters support streamlining and expediting approving energy infrastructure projects in America.








