
# KING SALMON IS KING!

## **FISHING LINE:**

Thermoplastics made with natural gas and petroleum molecules for strength and durability.

**EQUIPMENT:** Waterproof clothing, knife handles, fish bonkers, nets, gloves and more — all made with components derived from petroleum.

**ROD:** Carbon fibers made from petroleum, or fiberglass made with natural gas.



# **Energy is Everything.**

In virtually every human activity and invention, energy plays an important role: powering, building and improving the quality of everyday life.

## Salmon fishing illustrates this point.

Materials derived from petroleum make fishing rods and fishing line that are strong and durable enough to pull in a salmon that could weigh 50 pounds or more. Thanks to equipment made from natural gas and oil, fishing for tasty salmon is more efficient and more effective -- benefiting all of us who love to see salmon on our plates.

## **QUICK FACTS:**


- For 2015, state officials report an overall salmon catch of more than 3 million. Coho or silver salmon topped all others with 1,144,544 caught.




### **ALASKA ENERGY CONSUMPTION ESTIMATES 2015**
